O'Donnell Lecturer in Celtic Studies*

- 1. The O'Donnell Lectures shall be in connection with one or other of the following subjects, namely
 - (a) the British or Celtic elements in the English language and the dialects of English counties and the special terms and words used in agriculture and handicrafts,
 - (b) the British or Celtic elements in the existing population of England.
- 2. The lecturer shall be called the O'Donnell Lecturer in Celtic Studies and shall be elected by an electoral board consisting of:
 - (1) the Vice-Chancellor;
 - (2) a person appointed by Council;
 - (3) a person appointed by the General Board;
 - (4) a person appointed by the Board of the Faculty of English Language and Literature;
 - (5) a person appointed by the Board of the Faculty of Medieval and Modern Languages.
- 3. The lecturer shall hold office for one year but shall be re-eligible and shall be required to give not less than one or more than three lectures, the number of lectures within these limits being left to the lecturer's discretion.
- 4. The lecturer shall receive from the O'Donnell Fund such stipend and expenses as the board of management shall from time to time determine.
- 5. Each lecturer shall deliver to the Registrar a copy of his or her lecture or lectures.
- 6. The board of management may apply any surplus in the fund towards meeting the cost of publication of the lectures or, failing publication, towards increasing the emoluments of the lecturer.
- 7. The Board of the Faculty of English Language and Literature shall be the board of management of the fund.
