

## **Council Regulations 24 of 2002**

### **Academic and Other Posts**

*Redesignated as regulations by Council on 11 July 2002*

#### *Professor of Ancient Philosophy*

1. The Professor of Ancient Philosophy shall lecture and give instruction in Ancient Greek and/or Roman Philosophy.
2. The professor shall be elected by a board of electors consisting of:
  - (1) the Vice-Chancellor, or, if the head of the college specified in (2) of this clause is Vice-Chancellor, a person appointed by Council on the occurrence of a vacancy to act as an elector on that occasion;
  - (2) the head of the college to which the professorship shall be for the time being allocated by Council under any decree in that behalf, or, if the head is unable or unwilling to act, a person appointed by the governing body of the college on the occurrence of a vacancy to act as an elector on that occasion;
  - (3) a person appointed by the governing body of the college specified in (2) of this clause;
  - (4) a person appointed by Council;
  - (5), (6) two persons appointed by the Board of the Faculty of Literae Humaniores;
  - (7) a person appointed by the Sub-faculty of Philosophy.
3. The professor shall be subject to the General Provisions of the decree concerning the duties of professors and to those Particular Provisions of the same decree which are applicable to this chair.
